Whitney Collins, Surry County 4-H Agent and Sally Southard, Administrative Assistant for the North Carolina Cooperative Extension - Surry Center were honored recently at the 2016 Annual State 4-H Extension Agent conference in Kitty Hawk, NC. The submission of their "Clover Clips" newsletter placed them first in the State for the Team Periodical Publication Award. As the winner of the state contest, their submission advanced to the Regional level, where they were also awarded first place. Surry County is located in the Southern Region and includes the Virgin Islands and 13 states. The National Association of Extension 4-H Agents recognized regional and national winners at their annual meeting on October 12, 2016 in New Orleans, Louisiana.

WE LOVE 4-H CAMP!

This year, Surry County took four campers to Betsy Jeff Penn 4-H Camp in Reidsville, NC the week of July 31-August 5. Three of these campers participated in the Trekker Program where they learned and participated in canoeing, rock climbing, and leadership activities, and more. 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4-H Achievement Plan

Have you heard of the 4-H Achievement Plan? This form is a great tool to help you set goals and achieve them. Don't you feel great when you accomplish a goal?

The 4-H Achievement Plan will help you:

- Set goals and make plans to achieve them.
- Reach more of your goals.
- Enrich your 4-H experience.
- Set new goals that will help you grow and develop your skills and personality.
- Evaluate your own efforts and accomplishments by taking a look with your leader.

To be successful, your plan will require loyalty to your 4-H Club, your county, state, nation, and world. Service to others is very important. Creativity, responsibility, and leadership will be required. The satisfaction you feel for a job well done will make it all worthwhile. Below are a few examples of what you will find in the Achievement Plan. If you are interested in starting one, just call or email Whitney at (336) 401-8025 or whitney_collins@ncsu.edu.

Achievement Plans are due at the same time as 4-H Record Books (January 13, 2017).

Green Clover Achievement Award (for ages 9-18) To be eligible, you must meet Requirements 1-4 and 4 optional activities.

1. Attend at least 3/4 of scheduled 4-H Club Meetings.
2. Complete & turn in at least 1 project record book.
3. Participate in at least 1 county 4-H event.
4. Have a planning meeting with your 4-H Leader.

Optional Activities

- Have a parent or other adult to attend at least two club meetings.
- Learn what county & 4-H district you are in.
- Exhibit at least one 4-H project.
- Give a talk about your 4-H project before a group.
- Participate in one community service project.
- Attend 4-H District Activity Day.

5-6 Year Old Cloverbud Achievement Award To be eligible, you must meet Requirements 1-3 and 2 optional activities.

1. Attend at least 3/4 of the scheduled 4-H Club Meetings.
2. Have a planning meeting with your 4-H Leader.
3. Learn and lead the 4-H Pledge.

Optional Activities

- With your family's help, complete a curriculum book for ages 5-6.
- Learn and lead the 4-H motto.
- Make a collage or draw a picture to show what you've learned in 4-H and bring to club meeting.
- Show & tell about something you've learned in 4-H with your family.

*The 7-8 year old requirements are very similar.
