As she ran into dead ends at each turn, Extension and Surry Community College, Pilot Center, partnered up with her to create an incubator program from the onsite high tunnel in Pilot Mountain. the greenhouse. Recently there has been an addition of 10 raised beds; eight of which are a part of Charlie's Garden located behind the high tunnel.

Medicare Annual Election Period October 15th - December 7th

Your health needs change from year to year, and the benefits and costs of your health plan may also change each year. That's why it's important to evaluate your Medicare choices. The Annual Election Period is the one time of year when *all* people with Medicare can see what new benefits Medicare has to offer and make changes to their coverage.

Steps to Become a Master Gardener

If you would like to become an Extension Master Gardener, please follow the steps below:

- 1. Apply by December 31, 2016 to attend the training. Call Extension for application 336.401.8025.
- 2. Be selected by your local Extension office for the Master Gardener core training.
 - Find out about the program from an Extension Master Gardener Volunteer or the website: surry.ces.ncsu.edu
- 3. Submit and pass the background check.
 - Receive notification that the background check has cleared, register for the core course, and pay class fee (to be determined by January 1); training materials are included in the fee.
- 4. Complete the Extension Master Gardener core training.
 - 40 hours of horticulture education offered February through April.
 - Complete end of class exam to assess how much knowledge has been acquired.
 - Courses are taught by Extension agents, Extension Master Gardeners, and local horticulture experts.
 - Topics include: Plant propagation, flowers, turf grass, vegetables, landscape design, woody landscape plants, fruits, soils, wildlife management, integrated pest management, plant pathology, and entomology.
 - Core training is offered at the Extension Center in Dobson from 1:00 pm − 4:30 pm on Thursdays. The core training may include various class field trips.
- 5. Volunteer in your community.
 - Complete 40 volunteer hours in the horticulture area by May 2017 as approved by the county coordinator. Volunteer on projects and at events to deliver horticulture education in the community.
- 6. Stay involved.
 - Master Gardeners can remain active members in following years by attending ten or more hours of continuing education and contributing 20 hours or more of volunteer community service.
 - Report your volunteer and continuing education hours each month.

- Have adult supervision. Accompany your kids if you don't think they're old enough to trick-or-treat on their own.
- There is safety in numbers. If they're old enough to trick-ortreat without an adult, tell your kids to stay in a group.
- **Map out your plan.** Designate a route before your kids begin trick-or-treating and make sure they stick to it.
- **Take the long way 'round.** Have your kids trick-or-treat in areas where there are a lot of people around.
- Try tick-or-treat-friendly homes. Ensure your kids only visit houses with lights on.
- **Stay outside.** Make sure your kids don't go inside someone's house. They can get their candy from the porch.
- Remain visible. Dress your kids in a bright costume so others can see them. If their costume is dark, have your kids wear reflective strips or carry a glow stick or flashlight.
- **Remember, shorter = safer.** Ensure your kids' costumes aren't so long that they can trip over them.
- **Don't cover the face.** Instead of masks, have your kids wear make-up so they can see better.
- Quality-check treats. Check your kids' candy before they eat it.
 Throw out any candy that is not in its original wrapper or looks like it has been tampered with.



- Say "no" to strangers. Tell your kids to never accept a ride or go anywhere with a stranger.
- **Obey the law.** Encourage your kids to follow all the regular rules for walking around.
