What is the Extension Master Gardener Program?

The Extension Master Gardener Program is a national program of trained volunteers who work in partnership with their county Cooperative Extension Office to extend research-based information throughout the community. The first Extension Master Gardener Program was started in Washington State in 1972. Forty-six states now have Master Gardener Programs with over 18,000 people participating nationwide and in Canada.



The Extension Master Gardener Program provides gardeners with intensive education in horticultural principles. Participants completing training are certified as Extension Master Gardener Volunteers.

Extension Master Gardeners provide volunteer leadership and service to their community in gardening activities. This service can consist of answering gardening questions by telephone, conducting plant clinics, beautifying the community, and other activities that promote gardening.

In North Carolina, Extension Master Gardeners are sponsored by North Carolina Cooperative Extension.

How Do I Become an Extension Master Gardener Volunteer?

The desire to help others is the first requirement. A personal commitment to complete the required training and to serve a minimum of 40 volunteer service hours after completion is equally important. Volunteer hours are flexible depending on interest and time available.

To place your name on the list of those interested in becoming an Extension Master Gardener, complete the form in this brochure and mail it to Joanna Radford, Surry County Extension Center. Classes are held on Tuesdays and Thursdays from 1:00-4:30 p.m. beginning in February for six weeks. Cost is \$100 to cover materials. Space is limited.

How Do I Benefit From The Extension Master Gardener Program?

Through the initial training program and subsequent advanced Extension Master Gardener training sessions and workshops, you will become a more knowledgeable gardener. As part of your training, you will receive many publications and other related materials.

You will be able to attend Extension Master Gardener workshops around the State as well as international conferences. Through special seminars and workshops, Extension Master Gardeners are kept current on gardening information and methods. You will travel with other Surry County Extension Master Gardeners to interesting gardens and nurseries. And finally, you will meet many people who share your interest in gardening and desire to help others.
