ELDERBERRY \$11.50 EACH		
3 Gallon	QTY.	COST
Blooms early to midsummer, harvest from July through September. Tart taste, best cooked and used in jellies, jams, pies, etc. You can use the fruit dried, fresh or frozen..

BLUEBERRIES \$20.00 EACH		
3 Gallon	QTY.	COST
PREMIERE -rabbiteye variety that flowers late, ripens in June-July, large berries, excellent quality, very sweet.		
TIFBLUE - rabbiteye variety , large fruit, light blue, ripen late season, vigorous, very productive, and cold hardy.

RASPBERRIES \$11.50 EACH		
2 Gallon	QTY.	COST
HERITAGE - two harvest seasons, with a moderate yield in July and heavy yield in September until frost. Large, extra-sweet, juicy, dark red fruit that is good fresh, canned or frozen. 5' to 6' tall.

BLACKBERRIES \$11.50 EACH

NAVAHO - Thorn-less, medium fruit, ripens late and has superior fruit quality. Tasty!		
APACHE - very productive , great flavor, good yield, and very large fruit. They ripen in mid to late June. Space 5' apart in 5' wide rows.		
OUACHITA - Thorn-less, verry upright and erect canes, excellent flavor, and is very prolific. Ripening season is between that of Arapaho and Navaho blackberries.

GRAPES \$12.00 EACH		
2 Gallon	QTY.	COST
CARLOS SCUPPERNONG - One of the best pollinator grapes. Produces lots of small, 1/2 inch bronze fruit. Excellent for jelly and wines. Fruit is 16% sugar and ripens mid to late September.		
CONCORD - Thick, sour skins and a luscious, sweet interior, they're harvested in September through late October. This variety of grape is best suited for jams, jellies, and juice.		
SOUTHLAND MUSCADINE - Black, self-fertile with medium fruit and excellent flavor.		
NESBIT MUSCADINE - Highly recommended for home owner settings, as the vines produce fruit that ripens for over a month-long period. Has a delicious sweet flavor. Fruit is 20% sugar and ripens mid to late September.		

PEAR TREES \$26.50 EACH

KEIFFER - Large, golden yellow with coarse, white flesh. Very hardy, tolerating both drought and floods. Yields ripe fruit typically in mid-September or mid-October.

APPLE TREES \$24.50 EACH

ROME - Rounded, all red, and very glossy, with a thick skin and firm flesh. Primarily used for baking.		
FUJI - Yellowish green with red tint skin, medium, white flesh, crisp and juicy, and ripens mid-season.		
GALA - Golden with red striping; medium; white flesh; crisp; ripens mid-season.		
GOLDEN DELICIOUS - large, yellowish-green skinned cultivar and very sweet to the taste. It is prone to bruising and shriveling, so it needs careful handling and storage.		
GRANNY SMITH - Light green; large; white flesh, crisp and juicy; ripens late; good pollinator.		
HONEYCRISP - Red over yellow; white flesh; very crisp; juicy with a sweet-tart flavor; ripens in Fall.		
RED DELICIOUS - Sweet and juicy with a very mild flavor. The skin can be quite tough.

BELL OF GEORGIA - Large, firm, highly flavored fruit; ripens late August. Creamy white freestone flesh tinged with red.		
ELBERTA - Blooms in spring with an abundance of vibrant pink and purple flowers, followed by harvest in early to mid-July. Can produce up to 150 lbs. per season.

RED BUD TREES \$80.50 EACH		
7 GALLON	QTY.	COST
Small deciduous tree that typically grows 20 feet in height with a similar spread and a rounded shape. Redbud leaves are alternate, simple, broadly heart-shaped and 3 to 5 inches high and wide. Leaves emerge reddish, turning green as they expand.

RIVER BIRCH TREES \$107.50 EACH

Fast-growing, deciduous semi-aquatic; 50 to 90 feet in height. Diamond shaped, double-toothed leaves produce and erect or spreading canopy that covers an extensive area.

Easy care, drought resistant, highly adaptable shrub, makes a nice addition to a garden border, path, or in a mass planting.
