We are planning Christmas caroling, snacks, a bonfire, and a gift exchange for our December 9th meeting.

Pilot Club- In November, we had Carmen Long out to teach our group a beginner lesson in sewing. The kids cut and sewed Christmas ornaments. December is a busy month. We are doing our Santa picture fundraiser at the Mistletoe Market on Saturday, the 2nd, from 10 to 2. That evening we will be riding in the Pilot Mountain Christmas Parade. Our meeting in December will be our annual Christmas cards for the elderly, cookies & hot cocoa plus caroling on Main Street in Pilot.

Instead of our planned activity, the kids who braved the weather were able to interact with rescue dogs from Mayberry4Paws, who benefited tremendously from meeting new people. The children loved the hands-on opportunities and feeding them. Hopefully, our December 19th meeting will be less challenging! We'll get started on learning about dog breed basics and having a discussion of what the children already know and hope to learn. Some hands-on activities with a well-behaved rescue dog will be included.

Homeschool Club- Our homeschool clubs met twice during the month of November. Our focus skill was cooking. At our first meeting we learned about proper handwashing, tying back hair when cooking, cooking tools and their uses, and learned to measure solids and liquids properly. They put these skills to use at our second meeting, where they baked cookies and made cards for the Sheriff's Department. The employees at the Sheriff's Department were excited about their token of appreciation! We will be meeting next on December 7th, and we will focus on hand sewing skills. We will be sewing Christmas ornaments. Participants will get to cut out a pattern, hand stitch the sides, stuff it with fiberfill, and decorate it with embellishments. For our December 21st meeting, we will be doing a service project.
